The six Australians, all close relatives of mine, also entered wholeheartedly into the life of the school, and shared their many talents with us. Many of these participants described their experiences in the school and parish as being life-changing. The home visit program, in particular, gave our visitors a unique insight into living conditions here.

Ms Sarah Ryan has been providing valuable assistance in coordinating our administration documents and producing a staff handbook.

Current Secondary School Building

A great deal of planning has taken place to ensure that there is a smooth transition with the new school leadership team. Br Francis, Br John and Peter plan to work together very closely. Br John Corbett will assume major responsibilities in the areas of Finance, Building, and Administration, while Mr. Peter Shanahan will have major responsibilities in the areas of education, staff and students. Br John recently spent two weeks here familiarizing himself with our operation, and Peter traveled up from Arusha for a series of information and planning sessions.

### Building

At the time of writing the Stage 2 building is virtually completed, except for the installation of benches and cupboards in the science laboratories. We are also adding a number of items, including a large water tank, fencing around the sewage treatment plant, additional security provisions, and some modification in the IT laboratory.

The Stage 2 Building is linked to the existing Classroom block, and incorporates the following:

1. Library
2. Administration
3. Chemistry & Physics Laboratory
4. Biology Laboratory
5. Science Preparation Room

Our intention is to move furniture and goods into the new building in the last week on November, after classes conclude on 21<sup>st</sup> November. The library has been computerized. A considerable amount of work is involved in regard to the library, laboratories, and administration. As far as possible, we aim to have everything in readiness for the start of the new academic year in early January.

### Personal Reflection

My three year term as Principal of Beausang is rapidly nearing an end, and I am soon to return to Australia. My role here has turned out to be very different to what had been originally planned. The parish was to have assumed all responsibility for capital development, freeing me to focus on the educational and academic aspects of the school. In the changed circumstances following the departure of Fr Kevin McGarry, it was necessary for me to move into these areas. We have been remarkably blessed by the generosity of our donors, so that our school complex in 2009 is one in which we can take great pride. However, as a result, I have not been able to give nearly as much attention as I had hoped to the academic programs in the school.

The school has made a very good beginning, but it is still at the early stages. So much more is possible if we follow our school motto and 'Seize the opportunity'.

I confess to gaining particular satisfaction from the following developments:

- The school is now on a reasonably solid financial and administrative footing, and can plan with confidence for the future.
- The two major buildings constructed at the secondary school provide the opportunity for modern and high quality educational programs; detailed plans exist for future development.
- The sponsorship program is making it possible for our school to be faithful to its charter of catering for local needy youth; without this financial support, we would be forced to enroll only students whose parents could afford school fees.
- Our immersion program for visitors has been outstandingly successful, proving to be of great value to both our many international visitors, and to our school community. The links are mutually beneficial.
- Visitors always remark on the friendly welcome they receive; we are clearly developing as a genuine Christian community.
- Our students are gradually coming to realize their potential.

I would like to thank both the Beausang school community and the Embulbul parish community for their friendship and support during the past three years. I am well aware that my limited knowledge of African culture and language has been a major disadvantage in my performing this key leadership role, and so I am appreciative of allowances others have made. I have learned and gained much from the local community, and am appreciative of the support and kindness given to me.

I wish you all every blessing for the future.
